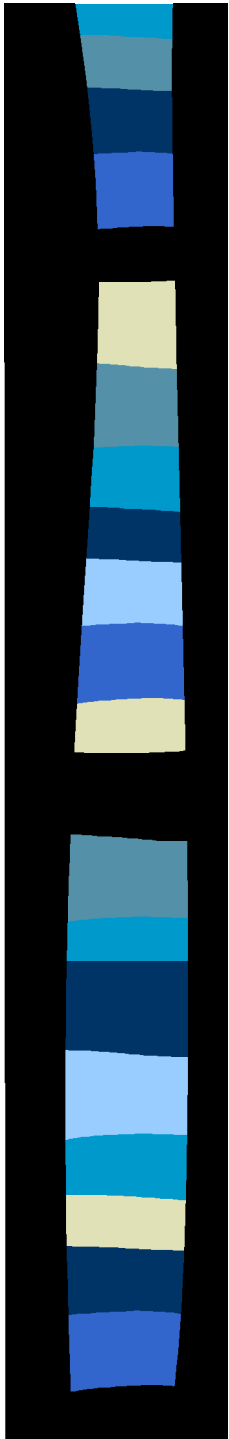


DISTANCE EDUCATION PLANNING COMMITTEE

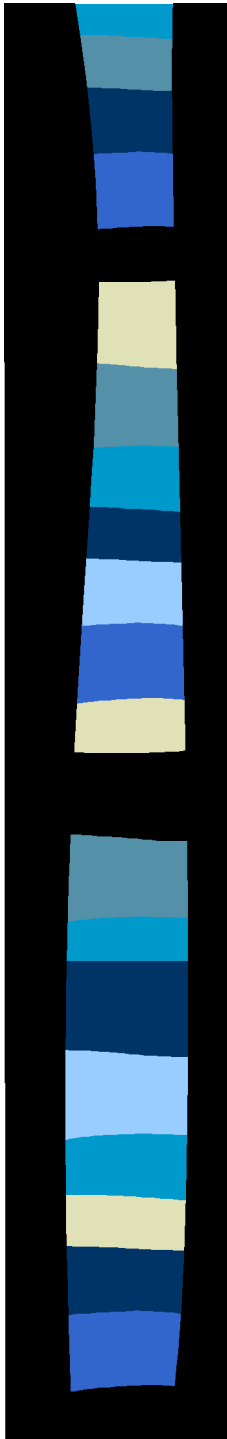

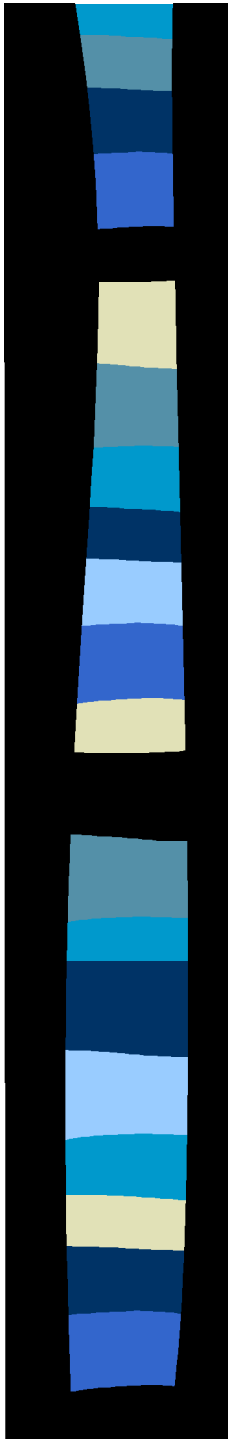

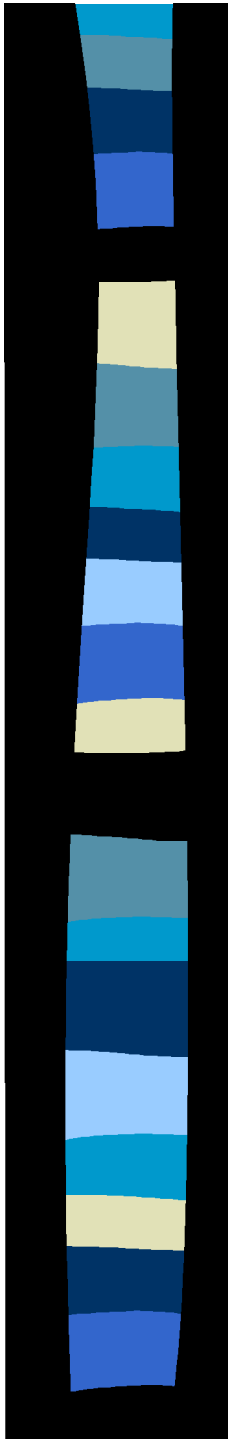

- Budgeting Requirements

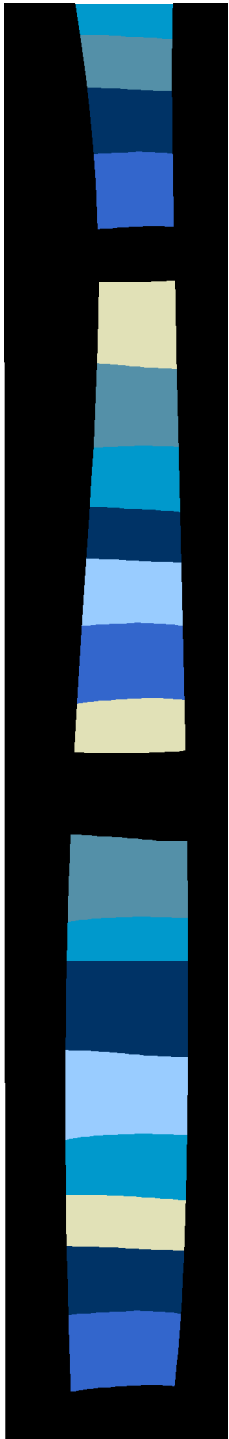

- Distance Learning Advisory Committee

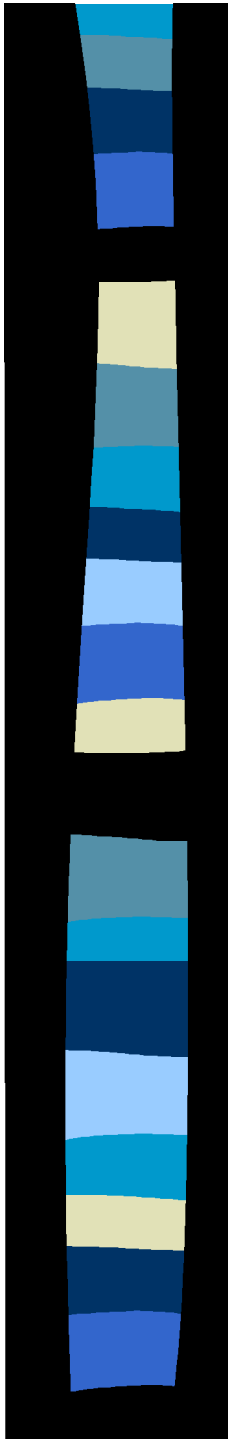


DISTANCE EDUCATION PLANNING COMMITTEE

- Each college/school within the University will develop their own strategy for distance learning within the context of the overall strategy for the University.

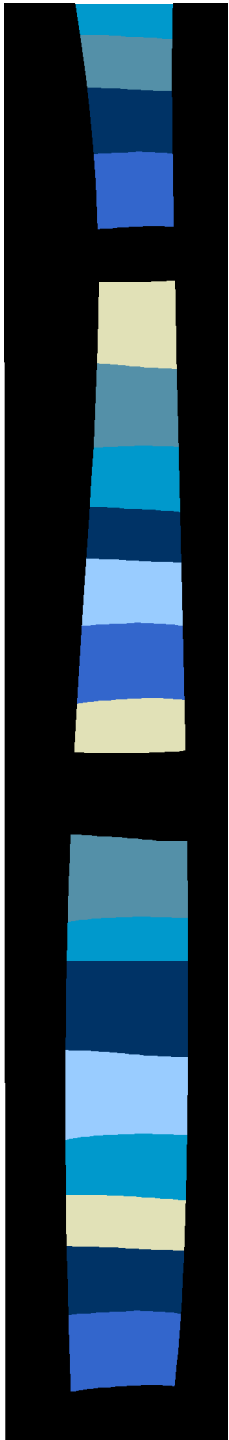


DISTANCE EDUCATION PLANNING COMMITTEE

Budgeting Requirements

- Budget assumes the existence of a high-capacity statewide and campus network infrastructure as well as digital library and other necessary support resources.
- Develop staffing requirements for distance learning such as:
 - Curriculum design support
 - Graphics design support
 - Computer programming
 - Faculty time
 - Other

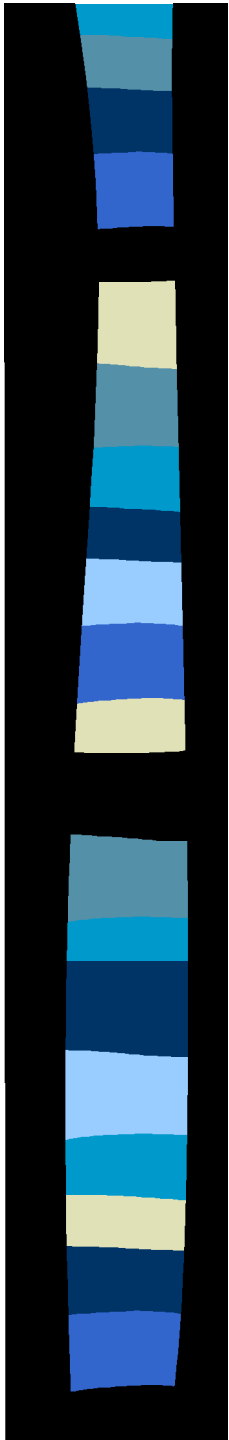


DISTANCE EDUCATION PLANNING COMMITTEE
