Prior admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School, which requires a separate application process;

A master's degree and either a specialist degree or evidence of meeting the requirements for district level licensure; A satisfactory Millers Analogy Test (MAT) score or Graduate Record Examination (GRE) score; A completed Educational Leadership Program Application; Application for Admission Form; A current résumé;

Two letters of recommendation (one of which should be from a current or former supervisor);

A current resumé; A statement of purpose; At least three letters of recommendation; <u>A prompted</u> An academic writing sample;

Finalists are selected for <u>an</u> <del>a personal</del> interview with the Educational Leadership <u>faculty</u>. <del>faculty admissions</del> <del>committee. The completed application deadline is February 1.</del>

Doctoral students will come to campus to meet with faculty and practitioners for a one-credit seminar that will serve as a valuable capstone for the distance experience.
