Admission to the M.Ed. Programs: Admission Admission to the Master of Education (M.Ed.) in Educational Leadership requires prior admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School. In addition, admission to the M.Ed. in Educational Leadership requires the following: a completed Educational Leadership program application; a valid teaching license; transcripts GRE or MAT when cumulative GPA or GPA on the last 60 hours of coursework is less than 3.00; Leadership Disposition Survey; statement of purpose; and three letters of recommendation (one of

which should be from all completed higher education degree programs; prompted writing sample; résumé; and two letters of recommendation (one of which should be from a current supervisor). An interview employer). Interview with the EDLE faculty or program coordinator may be requested. The Admissions for the Master's degree is a cohort based program that begins in the Fall semester; are rolling; therefore, applications for prospective students can apply at any time of the year. Application for admission must be completed before the required deadlines for each semester as set by April 1st. the Graduate School.
