Risks and challenges inherent in collaborations, including how success is defined, how power differences are managed, trust is built, and accountability assured, are critical in achieving mutually desired goals and benefits.

The Master of Public Administration and Nonprofit Studies program in the J. William Fulbright College of Arts and Sciences and the Master of Business Administration program in the Sam M. Walton College of Business are working together to offer the Cross Sector Alliance graduate certificate program. The program prepares students for a workplace in which they will be interacting with organizations from other sectors in joint projects or initiatives. Accordingly, students must understand the financial, accountability and general management challenges of the different sectors. In addition, the program also prepares students for work in different sectors and builds skills not addressed in stand-alone programs. In general, students will gain a fundamental knowledge of within-sector management issues, how those issues relate to cross-sector management and governance, and will be able to apply this understanding to practical scenarios.
