Failure to earn a "B" or better in any of the four required courses will result in dismissal from the program. A minimum grade-point average of 3.0 (A = 4.0), calculated from the University of Arkansas graduate courses in this curriculum, must be met as a graduationrequirement. Please note that if a student must retake a class to meet the grade requirements of this program, both the original grade and the retaken grade will count in the calculation of the GPA for graduationpurposes. While a thesis is not required, upon approval of the program director students may take up to six thesis hours to be applied toward the 30 semester hours required for degree completion. The six hours of thesis must be completed on the Fayetteville campus.

Students should also be aware of Graduate School requirements with regard to master's degrees.
