Description and justification of the request	<p>Changes to curriculum included the use of a combination of credit-bearing courses that range from one to four credit hours courses, the inclusion of varying delivery modes to optimize student learning opportunities, and the incorporation of new accreditation-required, curricular content across courses. These changes include the addition of twenty-five new courses (ATTR 5111, ATTR 5161, ATTR 5181, ATTR 5122, ATTR 5141, ATTR 5133, ATTR 5371L, ATTR 5153, ATTR 5151L, ATTR 5532, ATTR 5172, ATTR 5361L, ATTR 5342, ATTR 5341L, ATTR 5283, ATTR 5281L, ATTR 5332, ATTR 5501, ATTR 5422, ATTR 5431, ATTR 5442, ATTR 5542, ATTR 5611, ATTR 5621, ATTR 5361). Additionally six courses were changed including: changes to ATTR 5314 includes the addition of 1 credit hour to allow for additional course instruction; changes to ATTR 5473 included changes to the course title, the course was move to online and a project was added that serves as the program's comprehensive examination; changes to ATTR 5223 include changes to the course title, delivery mode and course description; changes to ATTR 5362 include the removal of one credit hour; changes to ATTR 5253 include the timing in which the course is offered in the degree sequence; and changes to ATTR 5272 include the simplification of the course title. Finally, changes to the program description to reflect curricular changes; updates to the mission statement, and assessment plan; modifications to the program prerequisites and application procedures; updates to the documentation requirements during degree matriculation; updates to the program's technical standards; modifications to the program retention and progression policies; and changes to the description of the requirements for the degree plan.   The Master of Athletic Training Program degree plan was initially developed to be in alignment with previous versions of the National Athletic Trainers Association (NATA) Educational Competencies, Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE) accreditation requirements, and the Board of Certification (BOC) Practice Analysis. Over the past several years, significant changes have occurred to both the profession and accreditation requirements resulting in the new CAATE 2020 Professional Standards and the new edition of the BOC Practice Analysis. The CAATE Standards dictate the standards related to program design, program delivery, institutional organization and delivery, and curricular content of an accredited athletic training program. Similarly, the BOC Practice Analysis aligns with the CAATE Standards and identifies the content used in the Board of Certification examination, the examination that must be successfully challenged by all certified athletic trainers to practice clinically. These curriculum changes are critical to aligning with accreditation requirements and preparing students to successfully enter the workforce. The program underwent a year-long strategic planning process that included conversation with various stakeholders (administrators, preceptors, students, and alumni) and identified how the program</p>	<p>Adding an accelerated program (3+2)   The Master of Athletic Training program proposes to create an accelerated Master of Athletic Training pathway (accel.M.A.T.) for Exercise Science undergraduate students in the Department of Health, Human Performance and Recreation. This total five-year program will draw upon and build on the content and requirements of the existing Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science and the existing Master Athletic Training degree through the proposed program, which will offer a pathway for students to earn both the programs within five years. As both programs involved in the proposed combined program currently exist at the University of Arkansas, all resources for the support of the proposed program are in place. Additionally, as the proposed program does not seek to recruit from other baccalaureate programs within the University, no other program will be impacted regarding enrollment or resources. By providing a five-year, accelerated Bachelor of Science in Exercise Science and Master Athletic Training Accelerated Program, the Department of Health, Human Performance, and Recreation provides students with the opportunity to decrease the time to a post-baccalaureate degree while continuing to provide students with a high-quality experience that meets requirements for the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE). The M.A.T. Program is a 59-credit degree plan, and the 24 hours of the degree plan proposed to meet the undergraduate EXSCBS requirements (40%) is below the maximum 50% allowed by the Higher Learning Commission for "4+1" (i.e., accelerated masters) programs and is on par with other accelerated Masters program's at the University of Arkansas. Peer programs in the region that have an accelerated program have anywhere from 16 to 42% of hours from the graduate program that can count towards both the graduate and undergraduate degree. Accel. M.A.T. will be allowed to take three additional ATTR hours (ATTR 5161 and 5172) as an undergraduate student, but they will not count toward the undergraduate degree. The total 27 credit hours of ATTR classes are required during the undergraduate degree because the M.A.T. program is cohort based. In order to have accel.M.A.T students enter into the cohort model and graduate on time, they need to have completed 27 hours of ATTR classes by the time they are fully admitted into the M.A.T. program. In summary, it allows the undergraduate student to matriculate into the cohort model once they become a graduate student without disrupting the timing of courses needed to graduate from the M.A.T. program.</p>

Description and justification of the request	<p>1) Original wording suggested the student should draw 6 hours of quantitative/computational electives from a lengthy list of such courses across campus, and that they could draw from other courses as approved by a Chair-appointed committee; this proposed change eliminates this lengthy list (which is too difficult to maintain in the catalog) and specifies that the 6 hours of quantitative/computational electives must be approved by the MS Geography student's master's advisory committee. 2) Instead of GEOS 5333 Research Methods and Materials in Geography, GEOS 5612 Research Methods in Geosciences is proposed as part of the required core (now 6 hours instead of 7). 3) Department no longer accepts "department application" which is vague (all application materials go through Graduate School. 4) Very minor changes to description to keep wording consistent (e.g., "MS instead of "M.S."), and adjustment of table of courses showing all of the requirements adding up to 30.  </p> <p>1) While the original approval for electives is reasonable, it makes more sense for the student to make curricular determinations in close consultation with his or her MS Geography master's advisory committee (which is already tasked with supporting the student's curricular decision making process). This can make the approval process more tailored to the student's background and interests, and leverages the existing structure and forms required by the Graduate School. 2) The department made a decision last year to offer one 2-hour research methods course for both MS Geography and MS Geology students, and this change reflects that evolution. 3) The wording on "department application" was vague and students have been confused about the process; currently the department simply reviews the application materials submitted to the Graduate School. 4) Other minor changes for consistency in wording and completeness of course list.</p> <p>We understand that the Faculty Senate may only consider minor program changes once per year (in December). However, request for approval in the Fall 2019 Catalog of Studies allows nine months to approve. A delay until Fall 2020 (21 months to approve) may result in students and faculty having unclear information about GEOGMS. The department advisory board is currently raising 450K GeoVision funds specifically targeted to benefit future GEOGMS students, and this effort should coincide with accurate information in the catalog as soon as is reasonably possible. Thank you very much for considering these minor changes and for any assistance you can provide to ensure they can be included in the Fall 2019 catalog.</p>	<p>Change in designated CIP code from 45.0701 - Geography to 30.4401 - Geography and Environmental Studies.   The new CIP code more closely aligns with programmatic expertise and content as offered through the MS Geography degree in the Department of Geosciences. The revised code applies to a program that provides "instruction in climate science, sustainability, environmental science and policy, research methods, geographic information systems (GIS), human geography, physical geography, remote sensing, and public policy," each of which are elements of instruction and faculty expertise in the MS Geography program. 	Description and justification of the request	First, students may now take GEOS 5733 Geospatial Data Science in Public Health (approved Apr 2022) as an alternative to GEOS 5543 Geospatial Applications and Information Science. Second the order within the course list has been adjusted to best reflect the recommended sequence.   First, Department of Geosciences currently offers online geospatial courses as part of the Graduate Certificate in Geospatial Technologies. Public health applications are not the focus of current courses, and these applications are rapidly expanding in the wake of a global pandemic. In Apr 2022, in collaboration with University of Arkansas Global Campus, GEOS 5733 Geospatial Data Science in Public Health was approved as a new course intended to become an alternative to GEOS 5543 Geospatial Applications and Information Science for students with interests in public health. Second, providing a course sequence that matches what the advisor is telling students makes more sense.	Changing CIP code from 45.0702 Geographic Information Science and Cartography to 30.4401 Geography and Environmental Studies.   Effective 2020, the National Center for Education Statistics recently established a new Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) code for "Geography and Environmental Studies" which better captures the geography teaching, research and service strengths developed in recent decades at University of Arkansas. For example, the new CIP code recognizes "climate science, sustainability, environmental science and policy, research methods, geographic information systems (GIS), human geography, physical geography, remote sensing, and public policy". The online geospatial certificates were previously coded as "Geographic Information Science and Cartography" which certainly captured a large part of what the certificates focus on. However, the new geography code which encompasses technical geography makes the most sense in terms of a) providing a strong geography and environmental studies context for the certificates (which simply reflects the reality of these studies), and b) meet ADHE viability requirements by combining the certificate with the bachelor's and master's degrees in geography.

Through courses that provide an opportunity to expand knowledge of the characteristics of students, curriculum and assessment, family partnerships, and working with a diverse population as it pertains to a specific cohort in a music education setting, degree recipients will improve the quality of education for these children.</p> <p>Within the past 5 years, the number of identified students with special needs in public and private school has doubled. There is no indication that the number will decline. On the University of Arkansas campus, music education students have one 3 hour non-music specific course required for their degree in music education (CIED 3033). This requirement is concurrent with other teacher certification programs across the country. Certified music education professionals receive certification in Arkansas and throughout the nation as "PreK-12 Music" indicating they are certified to teach all levels of music education. One of the six principals of the Individuals with Disabilities Act (IDEA) is "zero reject", indicating it is illegal to deny any students access to any program or activity in the public schools. Therefore, as a music teacher at the elementary or middle school level, general music teachers teach every child in the school population. Likewise, music teachers at the secondary level are required by law to teach every child who desires to be in a music class regardless of ability or disability.</p> <p>The current national statistic for students identified with special needs is 12.0%. In Arkansas, that number is 12.9% with some school systems reaching as high as 22% of the total school enrollment identified under IDEA. All teachers need additional training in working with students with disabilities. However, since music education is an area of study where teachers have contact with every single child at the elementary and middle level, much more concentrated instruction on how to effectively teach these students is desperately needed.</p>
