The undergraduate MicroCertificate in Equine Management would provide nine hours of online content based on research and best practices in equine care and management. It is designed to provide undergraduate students with a MicroCertificate in specific equine knowledge areas – general equine care and management, successful equine sales options, and equine behavior. This MicroCertificate will be open to undergraduates pursuing an Animal Science (ANSC) degree, those outside of the field of ANSC but with an interest in horses and county extension agents.

Requirements: To receive the undergraduate Equine Management MicroCertificate, students are required to take 9 hours of coursework in Animal Science within the Bumpers College of Agricultural, Food and Life Sciences. There are no prerequisites for enrolling in the Equine Management MicroCertificate courses.
