The global scope of the program allows students to pursue their interest in a particular region, time, period, or culture, while also being exposed to cultural diversity and contextualization in an increasingly interdependent world.

Description of specific change	Justification for this change
1. Removing HIST 22003 from the intro course list. 1a. Adding newly created HIST 23104/132H4 to the intro course list. 2. Moving HIST 22003 (soon to be 33043) to Methods in History 3. Removing HIST 49001 from HISTBA as a requirement, reducing total major size by 1 credit hour 4. Adjusted additional hours required for the 30 hour rule and the general electives to account for change in level of HIST 22003 (an option in some concentrations) and the removal of HIST 49001. 5. General formatting cleanup of cross-listed courses for clarity	1. This course is changing to HIST 33043 and will be moved to another requirement. 1a. Expands the range of options for the Foundations requirement and allows students meeting the Honors Interdisciplinary Requirement to apply that HIST course to the HISTBA degree. 2. The Department created a slate of elective courses for meeting in Methods in History requirement. The courses must devote 25% or more of their graded outcomes to methodological learning. The HIST 33043 History of Tomorrow course devotes 30% of its graded portion to dedicated training and learning in qualitative methods of research and data collection/analysis. 3. Streaming down new curriculum based on student feedback and difficulties staffing this particular 1 hour class. This will allow us to provide a more consistent experience for HIST students as they move forward in our degree plan. 4. Accounts for the reduction in size of major and level changes to ensure students still reach 120 total hours and meet the 30 hour residency rule. 5. General formatting cleanup of cross-listed courses for clarity
