Adding a new concentration within the HISTBA program.	Comprising four courses in the major, each Concentration reorients the Department's existing elective courses away from traditional regional categories into new thematic concentrations.
	The Concentration requirement is complemented by six hours of open electives, which allow students to select courses outside their concentration area and to apply one lower-level US or world survey (which benefits students who join the major with credit for multiple surveys) or thematic survey course, which gives them flexibility to choose courses based on interest. While some concentrations may naturally attract students seeking specific career sectors, no single concentration is intended to connect directly with a particular career, which allows students to grow and shift
	This concentration emphasizes the causes, course, and impact of war and conflict, along with issues related to peace and justice and their connection to social history. It will appeal to students preparing for military service, along with students interested in social justice and advocacy, ministry, law, public service, and the nonprofit sector.
