Obtain a C or better in all MUED courses.

Obtain clearance through the <u>Razorback</u> Office of Teacher Education <u>Development Hub</u> upon completion of the <u>MUED 20102</u> Introduction to Music Education course. (Clearance includes <u>application to the teacher education program</u> passing scores on accepted basic skills assessments and cleared background checks). For admission requirements and application go to the <u>Razorback</u> Teacher Education <u>Development Hub</u>. website.

Complete coursework with a cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher.

Obtain departmental clearance through successful GPA and coursework requirements, an advising interview with the Music Education Residency Internship Coordinator, and any other requirements specified by the music education program.
