Admission to the Pre-Licensure B.S.N. Program

Students interested in nursing will be admitted to the traditional, on campus pre-licensure BSN program must be admitted to the University of Arkansas as pre-nursing (P-NURS/Health) majors. Admission to the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing requires a separate an application in addition to the application to the University of Arkansas. In line with initiatives of the university and the College of Education and Health Professions, as well as the philosophy of the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing, a holistic admission process is utilized to enhance a diverse academic experience for all students and results in additional expertise in providing care to an increasingly diverse patient population.

Admission is competitive, not all applicants who meet the minimum requirements will be admitted to theprogram.We value communication skills, leadership experience, initiative, community service, and clinical experience, as well as accomplishments in athletics, employment, andresearch.The school's goal is to recruit and educate a class which will serve the needs of a diversepopulation.We consider factors not reflected in the academic record, such as evidence of extracurricular achievement or work experience; evidence of having overcome social, economic, or physical barriers; evidence of exceptional motivation, maturity;
