Program Requirements Step Two - Nursing Program Eligibility Upon notification from the academic advisor that a student is ready to enter the nursing program courses, the nursing department will complete a review to determine eligibility by verifying all of the followingcriteria: Completion of an accredited/state accredited and state board approved L.P.N., L.V.N., or L.P.T.N. program. Official transcript required to be on file with the University of Arkansas.

Proof and maintenance of an active, unencumbered license to practice as an L.P.N., L.V.N., or L.P.T.N. in Arkansas and/or any other state that has approved of the program. Not all state boards of nursing will accept outside-of-state education. See the program website for current list of the allowed states. Students admitted to the program will be required to maintain this active, unencumbered status for the duration of their enrollment in the program. Nursing program personnel will verify licensure.

Employment/nursing experience status of applicant based on the following:

Documentation from current and/or recent employer(s) where applicant is hired as an L.P.N. including institution or organization name, address, and supervisor contact information, area or unit of service, position title, and employment status (e.g., full-time, part-time, per diem). Employer verification of 2,000-L.P.N. practice-hours have been completed in the 24 months prior to the beginning of the program (form provided in University application).

<u>OR</u>

If the student has not worked 2000 hours in the last 24 months prior to the beginning of the program, but has worked the required hours previously as a licensed nurse, completion of a state board approved PN-refresher course within 12 months prior to beginning the program is required.

<u>5.</u> TEAS test score of 65% or above, taken within the last two years (information on the nursing <u>website</u>). The <u>two-year period is defined as ending on the first day of the academic term in which the student plans to begin the nursing in-program courses. website).</u>

Completed applicant packets received by each deadline will be reviewed, and acceptance into the program will be dependent on quality of the application and space availability.

Additional Program Information and Requirements

Professional nursing courses for L.P.N. <u>to B.S.N.</u> <u>toB.S.N.</u> students are delivered online through the University of Arkansas Global Campus. Clinical practicum hours can be completed within the student's geographic area with a qualified (B.S.N. level or higher) preceptor selected by the student.

Students must provide proof of all required clinical paperwork requested by the school of nursing, including annual criminal background checks and regular drug screens (the most current clinical requirements can be

located in the student handbook).

Students admitted to the program may request up to 3 credit hours of previously completed B.S.N. level course credit in substitution for a core L.P.N. <u>to B.S.N.</u> <u>toB.S.N.</u> program of study course. The nursing faculty evaluate core L.P.N. <u>to B.S.N.</u> <u>course substitution petitions for eligibility. Only courses taken within the last five years will be eligible for review.</u>

toB.S.N.course substitution petitions foreligibility. Students who have started an L.P.N. to R.N. or L.P.N. to B.S.N. toB.S.N. program at another institution are required to submit a letter from the nursing program director that institution stating eligibility for readmission. admission.

The minimum number of hours required to receive a baccalaureate degree at the University of Arkansas is 120 semester hours. The nursing major is exempt from the eight-semester degree plan since the program is admission-based.

Progression, Withdrawal, and Dismissal for L.P.N. to B.S.N. toB.S.N. program (NURSBS-LNBN)

For progression in the nursing program, only grades of "C" or above will be accepted. Students who make less than a "C" may not progress into courses for which that course is a prerequisite until the course is repeated and the required minimum gradeattained. Note that the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing uses the following grading scale and exam policy:

Grading Scale: **A** = 92-100% **B** = 83-91% **C** = 75-82% **D** = 62-74% **F** = below 62%

Exam Policy: A 75% average on class exams is necessary to pass the course. Once this criterion is met, other course grades will be factored into the final grade.

Course Failure

If a student earns a "D" or "F" in any course, the course may be repeated <u>once. Students who make less than a</u> "C" may not progress into courses that require it as a prerequisite until the course is repeated and the required

minimum grade attained. once. The course must be passed on the second attempt. If a student earns a <u>D, F, "D"</u> or <u>withdraws from the</u> "F" in a second <u>attempt, this results in dismissal from course</u>, the <u>nursing program</u>. student will be dismissed from the program and may not be eligible for re-admission.

If <u>a</u> the student <u>earns a "D" or "F"</u> does not earn a grade of at least "C" upon repeating the nursing course, the student may not enroll in <u>a second course</u>, the student will any nursing courses, continue in the school of nursing, or be <u>dismissed from the program and will not be</u> eligible for re-admission.

Course Withdrawal

If a student withdraws from a didactic course, the course may be repeated. No more than two <u>withdrawals</u> withdraws from the same didactic course will be allowed. If the didactic course is not passed <u>on</u> in the third attempt, the student will be dismissed from the program.

If a student withdraws from a practicum course, the course may be repeated once. The course must be passed on the second <u>attempt</u>. If the student does not pass the course within the two allowed attempts, this results in <u>program dismissal</u>. attempt.

Students who do not pass the Dosage Calculation Exam per handbook policy will be administratively withdrawn from the course. This may lead to a delay in graduation and/or dismissal from the program.

The one "D" policy applies only to nursingcourses. Students must maintain an active, unencumbered license to practice nursing. If the student's license becomes encumbered or inactive at any point in the program's duration, the student must notify the school of nursing <u>immediately</u> and will be dismissed from the program. For licensed nurses, the school of nursing is mandated to report positive drug screens to the board of nursing. Confirmation of a positive drug screen will result in administrative withdrawal from nursing courses and nursing program dismissal.

A positive background check may impede or halt the student's progression in the program and may impact clinical placement and eligibility for licensure. If a student is arrested during their program of study, the school of nursing should be notified immediately and the student will become ineligible for clinical courses pending the outcome of an investigation and/or judicial process.

The school of nursing will comply with the policies, rules, and regulations set by the Arkansas State Board of Nursing and that of the student's respective State Board of Nursing

Students who do not complete all required compliance documents as specified in the Student and Clinical Handbooks by the due date will not be enrolled into the clinical course and have to defer to the next available semester upon completion of pending compliance requirements.

If a student taking a didactic course with an associated practicum in the same semester decides to withdraw from the didactic course, they must also withdraw from the practicum.

Students should note that any violation a flagrant or established patter of the disregard to Eleanor Mann School of Nursing policies or code of ethics can result in course failure of the courses and/or dismissal from the program without prior warnings (see student handbook). Forms page on the nursing program website for performance improvement plan guidelines).

1. <u>Three performance improvement plans are evidence of a pattern of behavior that contradicts our policies and code of ethics.</u> A student with three performance improvement plans will meet with program administration and will be subject to dismissal.

A student dismissed from the school of nursing will be asked to self-withdraw from all courses or will be subject to administrative withdrawal.

Repeating Didactic/Clinical Practicum Courses (NURSBS-LNBN)

A student who needs to repeat a course in which they were unsuccessful must make a petition to the Student Affairs Committee in nursing and are encouraged to do so as soon as they are aware of the need to repeat a course. An academic success plan will be implemented upon approval as outlined by this committee. Students that withdraw or are unsuccessful will be reenrolled on a space-available basis according to the

following priority system: Priority Groups for Placement in Required Courses

First Priority — Continuing students in good academic standing ranked by admission cohort.

Second Priority — Students repeating a course due to withdrawal withdraw or failure.

Spaces in clinical practicum courses are limited and tightly controlled by accreditation, the State Boards of Nursing, and clinical agency policies. Enrollment in didactic courses are limited to space availability. A student reenrolling in a clinical practicum course (whether due to illness, course failure, or other reasons) will not be assured a clinical placement space in subsequent courses.

Readmission will not be considered for any student dismissed from the School of Nursing who obtained a "D" or "F" in one nursing course and was unable to make a "C" or better upon repeating thiscourse. Also, a student dismissed from a clinical practicum course due to safety, ethical, or dishonesty issues will be administratively withdrawn from the course and may be subject to administrative withdrawal from the School of Nursing following a fullreview.Readmission is not guaranteed to thesestudents.Students should note that a flagrant or established patter of disregard to Eleanor Mann School of Nursing policies can result in failure of the courses and/or dismissal from the program without prior warnings (see Forms page on the nursing program website for performance improvement planguidelines). Readmission Policies

Any student whose enrollment in the professional program of study has been interrupted may seek readmission following the steps below:

Seek readmission into the University of Arkansas (if applicable).

Readmission will not be considered for any student dismissed from the School of Nursing who obtained a "D" or "F" in one nursing course and was unable to make a "C" or better upon repeating this course, course or who fails was dismissed from a second course, or who was dismissed from a clinical practicum course due to safety, ethical, or dishonesty issues. Exceptions to this policy will be considered by the Student Affairs Committee in nursing on an individual basis and only in the presence of an extenuating circumstance. basis.

Exit Policies

Students must complete the requirements for the degree within five years of enrolling in the first upper-level nursing course. Nursing credits must be reevaluated (and may need to be repeated) if the student does not complete the Professional Program of Study within the five-year limit.

In addition to the program requirements, students must meet the university and college graduation requirements. This curriculum is subject to change to comply with national accreditation and the Arkansas State Board of Nursing Standards.

Justification for this change

- 1. This is to provide structure to the process and allow us to better plan for course numbers and instructor coverage. Right now students are getting admitted even after a term starts which does not provide the optimal atmosphere for success and program orientation.
- 2. This allows for those that have many years of experience that might not fall within the last 2 years. This has happened several times since COVID. The refresher requirement is the same one we have always used for RNBN.
- 3. The TEAS edit was for clarity. Defining that two year period.
- 4. Space availability will be based on student location and clinical space for the most part, but could also be instructor coverage in the future.
- 5. These changes were made to improve understanding and clarification of policies that have previously been misinterpreted
- 6. These changes are designed to help better support working nurses in their expectations of courses. Students need clarification that this is intended to be a part time program while they continue working and not a full time program while they continue working.
