Requirements

Admission Prerequisites for the Doctor of Education Degree: Formal admission to the Doctor of Education (Ed.D.) degree in Higher Education requires:

- Prior admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School, which requires a separate application process;
- A master's degree or approved equivalent (minimally, 30 hours of post-baccalaureate graduate work completed);
- A cumulative grade-point average on all graduate work attempted of at least 3.25;
- A satisfactory Millers Analogy Test (MAT) score or Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores (test scores usually at the 50th percentile);
- Relevant professional experience in the field of higher education or a closely related field;
- A completed Higher Education Program Application for Admission Form;
- A current resumé or vitae;
- A statement of interest;
- At least three references (using our forms);

A writing sample demonstrating the applicant's best writing;

A personal interview with a Higher Education faculty committee, which by majority vote decides admission.

Completed application deadlines are October 15 for Spring admission and March 15 for Fall admission.

Description of specific change	Justification for this change
Combined 9 hours of skill-based electives and 6 hours of general higher education electives sections into one section. The section currently reads as "15 hours of approved Higher Education courses".	This change will allow more flexibility in the degree plan. Faculty also believe that the majority of higher education courses are skill-based, so the distinction between skill-based and general higher education courses was arbitrary and not easily understood by students.
