Requirements

Prerequisites to Degree Program: The Recreation and Sport Management program undertakes a holistic review of applicants. For acceptance to the program, the student must meet the general requirements for admission to the Graduate School, have earned an undergraduate degree in recreation or sport management (or a related field), and <u>must have a minimum 3.0 GPA in meet</u> the <u>last 60 hours of undergraduate coursework</u>. Further, the student will <u>submit a resume/curriculum vitae and statement of interest to be considered for program admission</u>. following admission standards:

Application to Accelerated Degree Program:

<u>Applicants for the M.Ed.</u> in Recreation and Sport Management under the Accelerated Degree Program must be a University of Arkansas undergraduate student pursuing a bachelor's degree in recreation and sport management, completed at least 60 credit hours towards the B.S. in Recreation and Sport Management degree including RESM 20203, and must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.25.

<u>All prospective students who apply to the Accelerated Degree Program are evaluated by the Recreation and Sport</u> <u>Management Program faculty using a variety of factors including GPA, resume, 500-word interest statement, and</u> <u>contact information for three references.</u>

Courses Completed during the Final Undergraduate Year:

Accelerated Degree Program students may take up to 9 hours of graduate coursework (50000 and 60000 level coursework) in the last 12 months of their undergraduate degree that will be counted toward both their B.S. and M.Ed. degrees. The three courses and timing of completion are RESM 58803 (Fall) in lieu of RESM 38803, RESM 58103 (Fall) in lieu of RESM 40103, and a graduate level elective in lieu of an undergraduate elective. Upon completion of the B.S. degree (including the graduate courses), the Accelerated Degree Program students who have an average 3.0 GPA or higher in the 9 hours of graduate courses will be accepted by the Recreation and Sport Management Program faculty into the M.Ed. in Recreation and Sport Management degree program after admittance into the Graduate School.

In addition to the program requirements listed below, all candidates must successfully complete a written comprehensive examination, except <u>students</u> those completing a thesis. Students should also be aware of Graduate School requirements with regard to master's degrees.
