There will be no additional courses to formalize this program. For this reason, costs are not expected to increase over what is already being expended to support the program.

This is a completely online program that takes place at all the participating universities (Iowa State University, North Dakota State University, Oklahoma State University, and Texas Tech University). Global Campus at the University of Arkansas has already supported the development of Families and Aging that is delivered by the University of Arkansas.

This program prepares students to be practitioners in integrative aging studies by incorporating and approaching material from the four pillars of:

- 1. Holistic aging in context
- 2. Strengths-based and person-centered approach
- 3. Understanding of ageism and inclusion for older persons.
- 4. Linking theory and research to policies and practice

Students will identify demographic trends in aging in the United States and be able to articulate implications of those trends including policies, programs, and research activities for aging populations.

Students will identify health trajectories during mid and late life and design interventions and programs to extend well-being throughout life.

Students will differentiate between typical and atypical cognitive trajectories associated with aging as well as describe factors associated with those trajectories.

Students will identify changes in social cognition, social interactions, and changes in relationships associated with age.

Students will demonstrate an understanding of mental health challenges associated with middle and late life, critically evaluate interventions, and propose programs to increase wellbeing.

Students will define and evaluate positive aging in terms of biological, cognitive, social, and mental health.

- Identify multi-faceted challenges and strengths associated with aging processes within diverse contexts from the micro (individual) to the macro (society) level.
