# **Program Requirements and Description**

#### Requirements

Admission Requirements for the Doctor of Philosophy in Higher Education (HIEDPH) Degree: Formal admission to the Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D.) degree in Higher Education requires:

Prior admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School, which requires a separate application process; A master's degree or approved equivalent (minimally, 30 hours of post-baccalaureate graduate work completed); A cumulative grade-point average on all graduate work attempted of at least 3.25;

A satisfactory Millers Analogy Test (MAT) score or Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores; Relevant professional experience in the field of higher education or a closely related field;

A completed Higher Education Program Application for Admission Form;

A current resumé or vitae;

A statement of interest;

At least three references (using our forms);

A writing sample demonstrating the applicant's best writing;

A personal interview with a Higher Education faculty committee, which by majority vote decides admission.

Completed application deadlines are October 15 for consideration for fellowships Spring admission and graduate assistantships are Sept. March 15 for Fall admission. 15 for spring semester admission and Jan. 15 for summer or fall admission. Completed application deadlines for students *not* interested in fellowships or graduate assistantships are Nov. 15 for spring semester admission and April 15 for summer or fall admission.

Although no standardized test score is required for admission, a GRE score report may be required for competitive funding opportunities from the Graduate School and International Education.
