#### **Candidacy Exam**

Students will be required to take a candidacy examination in the summer following the <u>second-year</u> second year coursework as a requirement of the Ph.D. program. The exam will cover the <u>students'</u> students' major and minor content areas as well as research methods. <u>Grading of the candidacy examination is conducted by section (major, minor, research methods)</u>, such that students receive a Pass or Fail grade on each section. <u>To successfully pass the candidacy examination and move forward to dissertation research, students must receive a passing grade on all sections of their examination.</u>

Students who do not pass their candidacy examination on the first try will be given a second chance to demonstrate knowledge in a candidacy exam retake. This retake examination is section-specific such that students retake only the portions of the examination that were failed on their first attempt. This retake of the examination will occur between three and six months of receiving results from their failed examination, with the time frame being decided in consultation with the Management Department Doctoral Coordinator. Students who do not successfully pass the candidacy examination after the second attempt will be ineligible for continuation in the doctoral program.

Successful completion of all parts of the candidacy exam are required to begin dissertationresearch. Students must complete a minimum of 72 graduate credit hours beyond the bachelor's degree and 42 graduate credit hours beyond the master's degree. For students who apply to the degree program without a master's degree, a minimum of 11 additional credit hours in consultation with the Ph.D. coordinator will be required to fulfill the full degree requirements to include approved graduate courses. Additional hours may be assessed in individual cases to meet specific coursework deficiencies.
