Admission to the University of Arkansas Graduate School (Requires a $\$ 60$ non-refundable application fee)

A 3.0 cumulative GPA on the last 60 credit hours of attempted coursework in previous nursing program

Submission of curriculum vitae or professional resume
Submission of a Statement of Purpose outlining the rationale for pursuing a Doctor of Nursing Practice Practie and how the applicant fits the requirements of the program, and the mission and vision of the program.

Completion of candidate interview
Letters of recommendation from two professional references

Applicants that are Master's-prepared Advanced Practice Registered Nurses (APRN) may count up to 36 hours from the masters toward the DNP. To do so the APRN must have the met the following requirements:
Additional Requirements for master's-prepared Advanced Practice Registered Nurseapplicants:Completion of a Master's Degree in Nursing from a nationally accredited M.S.N. program
A.P.R.N. A.P.N.licensure - if required by student's state of residence

Certification as an A.P.N.
Qualified applicants will be admitted on a space available basis
Applicants who do not meet the above requirements may be referred to the Graduate Admissions Committee for special consideration and may be required to fulfill additional prerequisites.

## Progression Requirements for the Doctor of Nursing Practice Degree

Students are responsible for meeting the standards of academic and professional performance specified by the graduate programs in nursing. In order to progress in the program, students must adhere to the following:
Grade requirements as outlined below

Maintenance of an unencumbered registered nurse license
Compliance with the nurse practice act(s) which regulate(s) the student's license(s)

## Grade Requirement

A. A grade of " $C$ " or lower may be earned in a nursing course only once, with the following exception:

A grade of " B " or better must be earned in didactic courses with a clinical component.
If a grade less than " $B$ " is earned in either the didactic or clinical course, both must be repeated concurrently. $A$ grade of " $B$ " or better must be received upon repeat of the course in order to progress in the program.
Clinical courses and their didactic components may only be repeated once to achieve a grade of " $B$ " or higher.
B. If a second " $C$ " or lower is earned in a nursing course, the student will not be allowed to progress in the program, and will not be allowed to return to the program.
C. A student may only repeat a nursing course in which a "C" or lower has been received one time throughout the program. A grade of "B" or better must be received upon repeat of the course in order to progress in the program.
D. A student is allowed only one course withdrawal throughout the program.
E. Students who voluntarily withdraw from all courses, or who do not maintain continuous enrollment must reapply both to the Graduate School and the Eleanor Mann School of Nursing for readmission.
F. Grades of "D" or "F" are not accepted for credit.

Currently, there are approximately 280 CCNE-accredited DNP programs offered in the United States. There are currently 11 ACEN-accredited DNP programs nationally.

Why is the Program
needed if offered at
other institutions?
DNP programs differ in scope. While other programs in the state offer preparation for advanced practice nurses at the master's level, we are only one of two institutions in the state to offer a post-BSN program of study that will lead to the DNP degree with preparation as an advanced practice nurse. The program also affords MSN-prepared nurse practitioners opportunity to pursue the DNP regardless of area of specialty. Many DNP programs offer only the MSN-DNP option. Furthermore, numerous programs are offered online; however, many are not.
