This is the Finance concentration.</p>	<p>Industry wide needs are changing and becoming more complex, especially in Arkansas. Employers have voiced a concern in the scarcity of eligible managers with a supply chain education, especially beyond a bachelor's degree. Due to increased demands from customers, supplier, and shippers, employers need professionals with an advanced specialized understanding of supply chain. They need supply chain experts in innovation, sustainability, and market understanding, who have a broad business perspective. Employees who can adequately assess the most difficult challenges, then integrate solutions and manage long term change. The growing economy in Arkansas is in need of managers and leaders trained in the full skill set of supply chain; functional, technical, and social. Supply chain education must grow and adapt to meet the new and increasing needs of the industry.</p>
